If you've seen the movie Mary Poppins when you were young or with your children, you probably know about the "east wind". Burt noticed twice in the movie that the "wind's in the east" - which literally blows Mary Poppins into the lives of those who come to love her - and then blows her back out again when her time is done. As Mary Poppins comes and goes with the wind, she does not appear to have much say about it. But she accepts her lot and goes on to her next assignment, whether it's the Banks family or those coming next. She is "practically perfect" and does not let it bother her in the least. At least that's her plan. Nevertheless, she takes on whatever changes she is called to make.

Wouldn't it be nice if we were like her and "practically perfect in every way"? However, as we've already seen in our Lenten study and services recently, we miss the mark. We drop the ball. We point the finger. We may be practical but definitely not perfect. Mary Poppins, on the other hand, had little trouble making the necessary changes the 'east wind' brought.

The wind is changing. I had worked at a church as an associate pastor in a great position. Being in charge of outreach and evangelism, I was given a budget of \$100 monthly to spend on people, companies, or organizations. Yet, there were a few problems within the church infrastructure, and it was getting somewhat difficult. Still, I knew I had to be where God wanted me and for as long as He wanted me

Then, one evening on the way home after teaching a Bible study, I felt a nudge in my spirit and sensed the words, the wind is changing, impressed upon my mind. I had been thinking of anything but that, so it was a bit surprising. Yet I knew it was God telling me it was time to move on. God was initiating change. If we believe God has our best at heart, we can believe the change which the 'wind' (or God) is bringing is for our good.

Like Mary Poppins, this change was not orchestrated by us. But she did not dig in her heels and need to be carried away by the wind. She knew that change can bring good. She came in and went out graciously and willingly. Oh, to have her grace!

But if we're not practically perfect, is there a way for us to have it, also? Yes, it's already ours. Simply put, we can embrace the grace. Embrace that grace which God always gives us in every situation to overcome, to persevere, to stand up to, to bravely lead, or to take on change. Jesus said to Paul in 2 Corinthians 12:9a, "My grace is all you need". That means it's enough. It is enough for us to go forward. Realizing that can bring comfort.

Our churches are taking on a triple whammy of a wind this June when it comes to change: I am leaving, Scott is leaving, and Linda is leaving. That's a lot of change! But we must remember the verse from Romans 8:28 - "And we know that God causes everything to work together for the good of those who love God and are called according to his purpose for them." That's a lot of promise. In fact, His promise is always bigger than our change! And He will cause everything to work together for our good. Realizing that can bring us peace. Then Philippians 4:7b states God's peace will guard our hearts and minds as we live in Christ Jesus.

Together then, comfort and peace establish trust - trust in a God who is bigger than us and knows more than we are able to fathom. And trust brings rest for our soul. I pray that rest for all, knowing more can be accomplished when we are at rest than in turmoil.

I've enjoyed so much the time spent with you. But the wind is changing. And maybe it's even about to come from the east! Let's learn a thing or two from this nanny who navigated so well through periods of transition. Thank you so much for your warmth and your welcome during this time. I'll still get a chance to say a formal goodbye in June, but this is a moment I can feel the warmth. And I don't even need a cozy sweater.

Early Observances of Memorial Day

The <u>Civil War</u>, which ended in the spring of 1865, claimed more lives than any conflict in U.S. history and required the establishment of the country's first national cemeteries.

By the late 1860s, Americans in various towns and cities had begun holding springtime tributes to these countless fallen soldiers, decorating their graves with flowers and reciting prayers.

Originally known as Decoration Day, it originated in the years following the Civil War and became an official federal holiday in 1971. Many Americans observe Memorial Day by visiting cemeteries or memorials, holding family gatherings and participating in parades. Unofficially, it marks the beginning of the summer season.


