A note from Pastor Lisa

I got a text message yesterday (June 16th) from Kristi's Clothing Store, in downtown Owatonna, to say that they were having a big summer sale. Well, of course, I had to run right down to pick up a few more items for my new "job." As I walked in the door the realization hit me that I haven't done anything like this for so long. I haven't walked into a store other than a grocery store since our state was shut down due to the Corvid 19 pandemic, but when I walked through Kristi's door it felt like life was starting to go back to normal.

Or is it? I don't think we can ever go back to the old way we did things, before masks, Plexiglas barriers, and obsessive sanitation. Going back to normal has to mean we are entering instead into a new normal. We hear these buzz words all the time in the news "we are entering into a new normal" but it is one thing to hear these words it is another thing to live them-to live in this ever changing culture. It feels like the worries we had in February have turned into hard realities today.

It is hard to believe that within the first weeks of June so much has happened in our already unsettled world. On May 25th George Floyd an African American man was killed by police officers in South Minneapolis. What started as a local news story on Memorial Day had by Tuesday exploded into a world-wide protest after the cell phone footage of his death went viral. No more could we look away and pretend thing like this don't happen, especially in Minnesota.

The Bishops of the United Methodist North Central Jurisdiction describe our jurisdiction as "a place of vibrant big cities, small towns, fields, farms, forests, rivers, lakes, the Great Lakes, prairies, is often known for being nice—Midwest nice. The brutal killing of George Floyd laid bare that underneath the veneer of nice exists lingering and persistent racism, a racism that poisons our public life, stifles God-given human potential, and diminishes us all.

In Paul's letter to the churches in Ephesus: "For Christ is our peace... he has broken down the dividing wall, that is, the hostility between us." Ephesians 2:14

As members of The United Methodist Church we must affirm that racism is sin and antithetical to the gospel, "that racism is a rejection of the teachings of Jesus Christ... denies the redemption and reconciliation of Jesus Christ," and "that racism robs all human beings of their wholeness."

Together we commit ourselves to our baptismal vows to renounce the spiritual forces of wickedness, reject the evil powers of this world, to repent of our sin, and to use the freedom and power God gives us to resist evil, injustice, and oppression in whatever forms they present themselves."

Perhaps our living into a new normal means that we recommit ourselves to live out our baptismal vows and go back to our United Methodist roots and realize what it means to be a church that is grounded in these vows.

John Wesley would ask "How is it with your soul" My sister Heidi posted this question on Facebook. Her answer is: "My soul is not well. It hurts and begs to know my part, and to know the actions I am to take to rid our society from the evils of racism." Let us continue to be a church that continually asks what our part in healing a broken world is. To be a church that is a safe place where people can ask hard question and in doing so our "new" normal will be so much better than the way it was.


Vision of the Church
