

Lent is here! On Wednesday February 17<sup>th</sup> the first days of Lent began with our Ash Wednesday Service here at the Church. It was our first in-person worship since our brief reopening in the fall and it was so nice seeing all your faces again. I have to say, though, that when I first stepped into the pulpit and saw all of you – I had to do a double take –for I moment I thought "why are people here?" For we have gotten so used to playing, singing and preaching to the camera in an empty church, except for Dave Krause who has faithful brought Jean here every week to sing. Jean, Gaylene Sally and Audrey have faithfully sung—when we couldn't. Thank you! Thank you Mary and Thank you Sandy-for faithfully bringing God's message to our church, our community and beyond.

Last year during lent the world began to shut down but this year the world is starting to open up again. Like a butterfly breaking free from her cocoon and spreading her wings for the first time – we, to, are beginning to open up to a new reality - to a post-corvid reality.

Our worship series this year is called Holy Vessels: A Lenten Season of Recovery. This series has been used in past years by churches but reworked to fit our time. Because we need to be remained this year especially that we are holy vessels a little battered and broken – like a piece of glass...

"Beach glass begins as something whole and yet discarded. As it is tumbled by the sea, it is broken and polished until it becomes a treasured "mineral gem." We do not embrace that suffering is necessary or God-given, but that suffering is a part of life. When pain comes and brokenness enters our lives, Jesus reaches out to touch and remind us of the Treasure that we *all* are—worthy of new life in the midst of hopelessness. In a year when pandemic has wreaked havoc on our world, we begin by affirming our journey to physical health."

Even in our brokenness Jesus see us as worthy of healing and being made whole again, for we are treasured. For the next five weeks we will continue to explore areas which are in need of healing.

We can be part of this effort by collecting food or making a donation. As we help serve the hungry in our midst, we are also serving Jesus.




### **MnFood Share**

# Masks are required. If you do not have a mask, One will be provided to you!

#### **Arrival**

- Enter through the main doors only. The other doors will remain locked.
- Please remain 6 feet apart from others as you enter.
- If you brought an offering, please leave it in offering plate.
- Please do not gather to talk at this time. You are welcome to do so after the service outside.
- An usher will direct you to a pew.

## Where to Sit

- Every other pew will be cordoned off. Proceed to the first pew open at the very front of the church. We need to fill these first to minimize people walking past other people.
- Family members may sit in the same pew together.
- 2 non-family members may sit in the same pew but on opposite ends, at least 6 ft. apart. You must enter and exit from the end of the pew at which you are sitting. Do not slide across the pew.

## **Dimissal**

- After the service, please exit directly out the main doors. The rows in the back will exit first.
- Please remain 6 ft from others.
- You are welcome to gather outside out of the front of the church to talk with others, but please practice social distancing.
- Do not block the exit area leading outside of the church.


